In its first three years, the number of patients served by Pine Rest's innovative Psychiatric Urgent Care Center has exceeded all expectations with 13,500 persons experiencing a mental health crisis receiving same day assessment and treatment. Dr. Bibhas Singla, Medical Director, and Kyle Hoffmaster, Director of Patient Access, both with Pine Rest's Hospital & Residential Services, as well as Dr. Natalie Wallace, will share insights on the successes and challenges they've faced with opening the first psychiatric urgent care center in the region.
